P-16, colleges, and high schools seek consensus on dual enrollment

CHEYENNE – The Wyoming P-16 Education Council will hold a series of meetings in Cheyenne to develop consensus on minimum educational standards for post secondary education options programs, more commonly known as dual and concurrent enrollment. Legislation passed in the 2010 directs the Wyoming Community College Commission to conduct discussions to develop consensus on guidelines for these programs, involving representatives of the seven community colleges and the University of Wyoming, including administrators, faculty and board members, the Wyoming Department of Education, school district administrators, teachers, and counselors, and representatives of students and parents. The P-16 Council is coordinating the consensus building process through a contract with the Commission. Additional work will be done during the rest of the summer and fall to gather more information from other stakeholders and in other communities.

A group of more than 35 people from throughout the state representing these groups will meet in Cheyenne at Laramie County Community College June 7-8, and again June 28-30 to start the process. Meetings will begin on Monday, June 7 at 8:30 a.m., at LCCC, in Room 120 of the Training Center. The meetings are open to the public, and time will be reserved for public comments.
